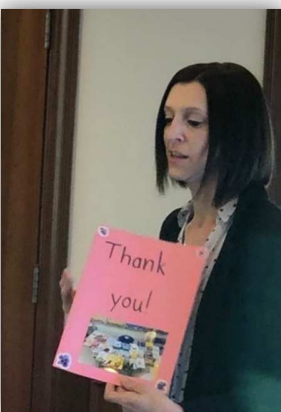

I hope you will all be able to attend these meetings and enjoy the food, fellowship, and programs with us.

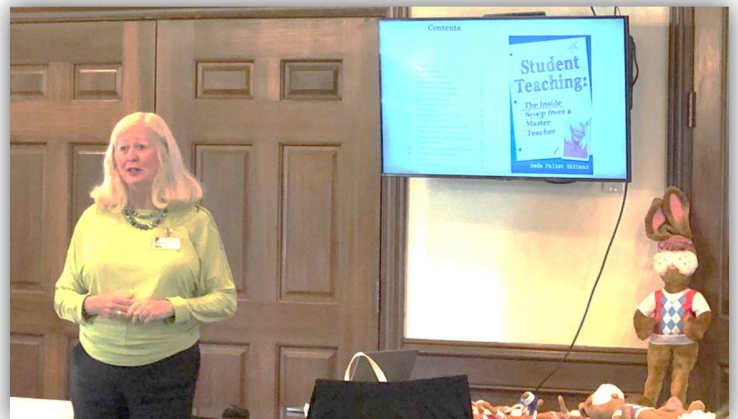

Projects

Project Period: Our New Service Project Terry

Project Period is an ongoing drive at the Butler area YWCA to collect and distribute tampons, sanitary pads and reusable menstrual cups to women and girls in need. It is also an advocacy effort to end the stigma and mystery surrounding menstruation and women's bodies with the ultimate goal of changing policies in order to make these products more affordable and accessible to all who need them.

Why is this so important?

- *Menstrual products are costly.
- *Menstrual products cannot be purchased with SNAP or WIC benefits.
- *Menstrual products typically aren't donated to shelters and food banks, even though they are an essential need.
- *Without access to menstrual products, women and girls may turn to make-shift alternatives like cloth, rags, diapers, or paper as a substitute.

A recent study found that 64 percent of the women surveyed had been unable to afford period products during the previous year and 21 percent experienced this problem on a monthly basis.

Almost half had times during the past year when they had to choose between food and period products.

Project Period makes monthly kits available at food banks, shelters, and other community locations. It supplies counselor-identified high school students with monthly kits and sends home multiple kits for use over the summer.

Alpha Xi can assist this important cause by donating supplies and assembling kits.
