### HONORING OUR FOUNDER

In May, 2022, Delta Kappa Gamma's founder, Dr. Annie Webb Blanton, was accepted into the National Women's History Museum (NWHM), which is an innovative online museum dedicated to discovering, interpreting and celebrating women's diverse contributions to society. She is included in the "Chronicles of American Women" segment, as she was the first woman president of the Texas State Teachers' Association and the first woman in Texas to hold a statewide elected office. The museum reaches more than four million visitors each year, ensuring that she will be recognized among the many women who have had a significant impact in the U.S. Congratulations, Dr. Blanton, for being an inspiring role model and trailblazer in the fields of education and politics.
