GRANT AND SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES AND DEADLINES

DKG offers our members many wonderful opportunities for enrichment grants and academic scholarships on both the state and national level. Alpha Xi members have taken advantage of these enrichment grants to travel to Hawaii, Portugal, and the American West. If you are still taking classes, there are funds available to help with those expenses.

You will find the links to these scholarship and grant opportunities at the end of this message.

At first glance, the forms may seem long and involved. They really are not. If you download them in word format, you can type your answers right on the forms. There are questions about your involvement with DKG on the state or national level. Do not let those questions stop you from applying. Many of the recent winners were active on the local level only.
